Adverbs add style and detail to your writing.

Adverbs can start sentences and have a real impact on your writing.

He walked **cautiously** to the cave.

Cautiously, he walked to the cave.

He works **really** slowly.

Really, he works slowly.

The time went **fairly** slowly.

Fairly slowly, the time went.

They talk **meanly**.

Meanly, they talk.

They will go to the shop **afterwards**.

Afterwards, they will go to the shop.
