

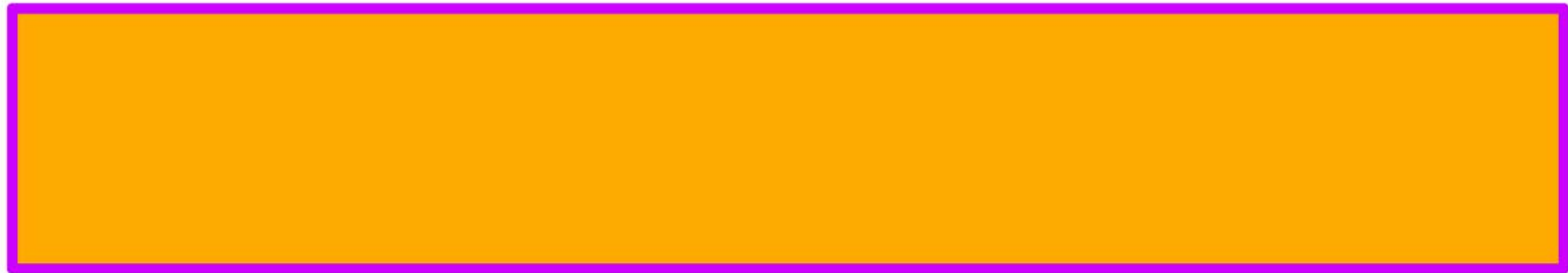

There are 3 main prepositions for time: in, on and at.

Use in for years, seasons, months and parts of the day.

in 1912, in Autumn, in January, in the morning.

Use on for dates and days.

on 2nd September,
on Monday

Use at for night, time and festivals

at night, at 12:30,
at Christmas

Use <u>in</u> for years, seasons, months and parts of the day.	in 1912, in Autumn, in January, in the morning.
Use <u>on</u> for dates and days.	on 2nd September, on Monday
Use <u>at</u> for night, time and festivals	at night, at 12:30, at Christmas

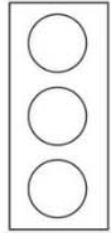
