Conditionals



A conditional sentence is one in which one thing depends upon another.

Often we use 'if', but there are others.

Conjunctions used for the conditional

unless ^{if} provided so long as providing would & (verb)

I would help you if I could.

If the weather is bad, we won't go out.

He will get a great job providing he works hard.

We will be there, so long as the train is on time.

Conjunctions used for the conditional

unless if provided so long as providing would & (verb)

- 1) If I do this, I will (may, might, can) (be able to) do this.
- 2) Unless I do this, I will not (may not, might not, cannot) (be able to) do this.
